#### Easter Hunt

For Children:

You will need an adult's help with this. Ask them kindly if they have time to do this, perhaps sometime over the Easter weekend.

For (grand)parents/carers:

There is a sheet with instructions in the Easter Hunt envelope.

## Make

#### Jesus Loves Us Bracelet

(Not suitable for children under 3. Please supervise to avoid swallowing of small beads)

- Find the cross bead. The cross is the symbol of Jesus. Put it in the centre of your elastic string. This is the start of your bracelet.
- Find the four shiny glass beads. These beads are for you and the people you love. They should go on either side next to the cross, always close to Jesus.
- 3. The wooden beads are for all the colourful people in the world. Put them on the string, as if they are all holding hands!
- 4. Ask someone to tie the ends of the cord together to finish the bracelet.
- 5. Well done! As you wear your bracelet, remember that Jesus loves us all, and that he asks us to love one another.

## Think

Something to think about, for young and old.

Goodness is stronger than evil.

Do you think this is true?

# Pray

Over the coming weeks we will be making a paperchain of prayer.

In your bag are 2 strips of paper with prayer hands printed on them, one with 'Please' and one with 'Thank you'.

Talk together about one thing you are grateful for and write it on the 'thank you' strip as a prayer.

Then think about something you would like to ask God to do - perhaps to help you or someone you care about. Write this on the 'please' strip.

Bring the two strips to church, so we can add them to our paperchain of prayer.
