#### **Prayers and Prayer Pointers**

## Monday 19th May

- On this day in 1536, Ann Boleyn, second wife of Henry VIII was executed, as part of a chapter of English history that many of us have studied at school, or watched TV programmes about, but which continues to effect the political and religious landscape in this country.
- Today, there are still many people whose lives are at risk because of the choices and whims of powerful, unchecked, selfish leaders. Join in prayer for all affected by tyranny, bullying and patriarchy.

#### Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> May

- What can you see from where you are sitting / lying / standing, right now?
- As you look around, try to look with the eyes of God what would God see? What elements of the view might need prayer?

#### Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> May

- Why not use a simple mantra today keep coming back to it throughout the day, as a way to ground your experience of living through your day as part of your journey of discipleship. You might like to write it down and keep it in your pocket so you keep feeling it, or say it aloud every time you stand up or sit down, or set an alarm on your phone to remind you of the mantra every hour...
- You could choose your own mantra that works for you, or use this one: 'Show me your way, O God,'

#### Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> May

- Living, loving God, today I pray for all affected by illness and pain. Into the cloud of their situation, bring your healing, comforting light, I pray. Amen.

#### Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> May

On this day in 1998 the Good Friday Agreement was accepted in a referendum in Northern Ireland, with around 75% of the population voting 'yes'. This agreement was a major development in ending the 'Troubles' and bringing peace to Ireland.

- God of peace, today I pray for all places affected by conflict and war. May those in power learn the lessons of history and recognise that peace is the only way forward and is worth the cost. Bring ceasefire, lasting peace, healing and wholeness, I pray, O God. Amen.

## Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> May

Today is Aldersgate day, marking the anniversary of John Wesley's experience Of having his 'heart strangely warmed' when he attended a meeting in Aldersgate, London in 1738. - His personal response to this encounter with the Spirit transformed his life, revived Christianity in the UK, and led to the creation of the Methodist Church!

- Pay attention today – what small act of revival might God be inviting you to take, in your own life, in your community, in your church? What is God inviting you to get involved in? Pray about anything that comes up.

#### Acts 11: 1-18

The apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw four-footed animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

#### John 13: 31-35

When Judas had gone out, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."
