Use the shapes to decode the answer

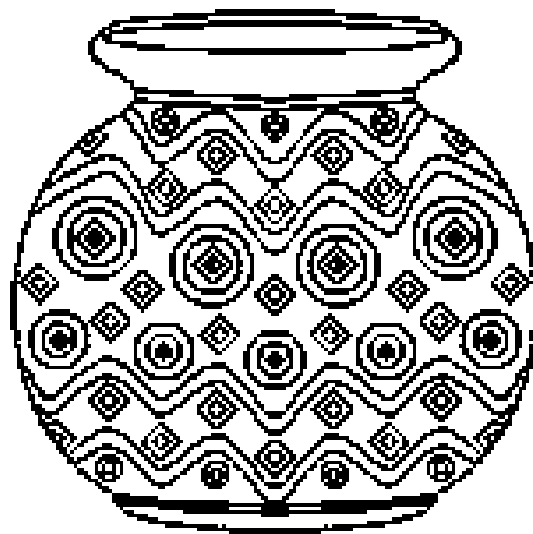


The 29th September is called Michaelmas or the day we remember St Michael and All Angels.

Remember to colour them purple with yellow centres

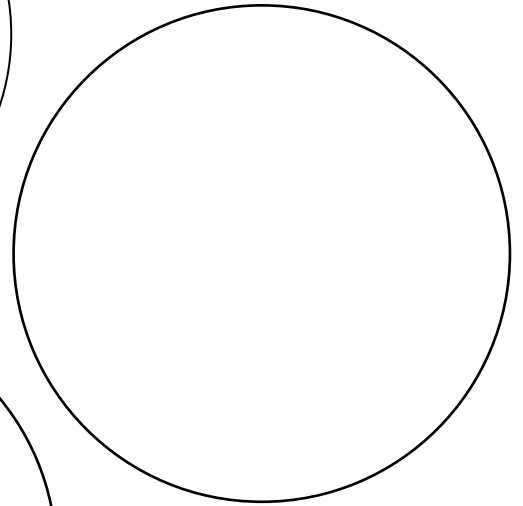
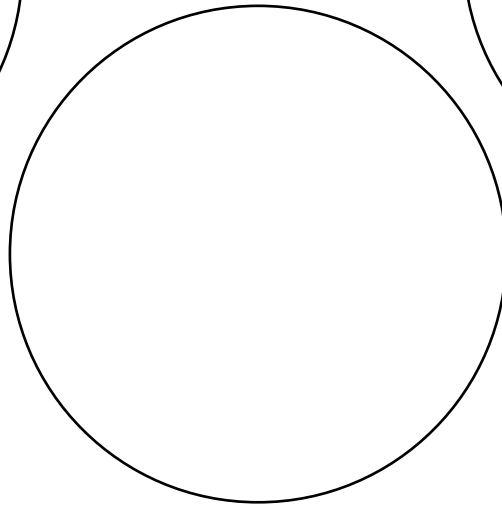
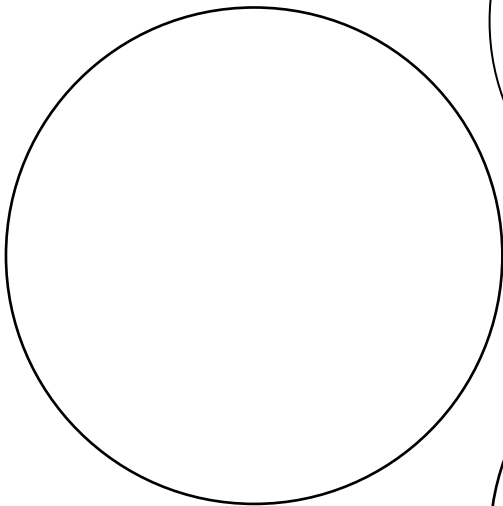
